



U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Conducting Five-Year Remedy Review at American Thermostat Superfund Site, South Cairo, New York

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is currently conducting the third five-year review of the cleanup activities at the American Thermostat Superfund site located in South Cairo, New York. The purpose of the five-year review is to ensure that the implemented cleanup at the site is functioning as intended and continues to be protective of public health and the environment. To conduct the five-year review, EPA will review site operations, maintenance and monitoring information, as well as the status of any land-use controls.

EPA welcomes community input concerning this site, especially any concerns about the implemented cleanup. Written correspondence should be sent before August 12, 2013 to the EPA Project Manager for the site listed below.

It is anticipated that the five-year review will be completed by late August 2013. Once the five-year review is completed, the results will be made available in the local site repositories:
